PP statement of intent – 2022

As a school community we work on the principle of "no child left behind".

At Gartree High School we have high aspirations of all students. This means that we want and expect all of our students to participate in a wide range of activities, both within the normal school day and outside of it.

We want our school to reach out to all – both within the school and with our wider local community.

Over the year we have systematically developed a wraparound approach to PP spending. Using it dynamically to address needs highlighted by parents, teachers and the pastoral team. Each PP student's needs are different and require different interventions.

We now have clear tracking in place for each of our PP students, that allows us to demonstrate





The result of this approach was recognised in the review that took place in December of 2022. Our strengths and whole school understanding were praised:

Whichever member of staff I spoke to during my visit, the same message was clear; Gartree staff genuinely care, particularly for their PP eligible pupils; 'Why shouldn't they have branded trainers?!'.

Gartree staff know their pupils extremely well; all staff spoke at length about specific pupils, their needs, how they are being supported and the impact it is having. This has led to the hardship fund being set up to support those not eligible but in need.

PP eligible pupils know to speak to their form tutor/AHOY/HOY/JL or BR if they require anything or support.

Finances are well tracked and documented on an individual pupil by pupil basis, saved on a shared drive for all stakeholders to access as appropriate. CL is continuously looking into how to reduce the amount being spent whilst researching creative low cost/free alternatives. A report is provided to SLT to show real time spend and trends.
